Roberto Sandoval is a native of San Diego and currently lives in Los Angeles. He has served on numerous committees and boards of Latinx/Latina/Latino Deaf, DeafBlind, DeafDisabled, Hard of Hearing and Late-Deafened (DDBDDHHL) and sign language interpreter organizations.

In 2017, Roberto was the co-curator for the Dyer Arts Center at Rochester Institute of Technology's National Technical Institute for the Deaf (NTID) featured the artwork of Latinx/Latina/Latino Deaf artists during the "Arte del Corazón" exhibit. In 2018 and 2019, Roberto was one of the Deaf Arts Jubilee presenters teaching Mexican Arts.
